Letter from the Vice President

Brothers,

The Constitution established the United States as a democratic republic. It is democratic because the people oversee themselves, and it is a republic because the government's power is derived from its people. Basically, our government – local, federal, and local – is selected by the citizens.

Besides voting for officials, we also vote on issues affecting the community and (more importantly) those living and operating within the community. Voting in an election and contacting our elected officials are two ways that voters can participate in our democracy.

More importantly, we need to empower our youth eligible to vote, to become active participants in process. Of the 1.5 million voters in Palm beach County Black voters comprise of 14% of the votes. It is inherent we get all eighteen year olds and above to execute their right (to vote) through education of the political system and who is running for what.

Our Political Action Committee (PAC) is ripe to descend into action towards this end. In layman terms the purpose of the PAC is raising and spending money to elect and rout candidates. PACs can give funding to a candidate per election (primary, general or special).

DDL has been out-front in procuring voting stations and individuals to work the stations all at a profit to the fraternity! With our bevy of lawyers and other professionals, we can make a difference in the community in several ways.





SENIOR SPOTLIGHT - Brother Isaac Robinson - Delta Delta Lambda '68



Isaac "Ike" Robinson, Jr is a retired teacher and a former city commissioner. Robinson, one of the driving forces behind a multi million dollar renovation and reopening of the Sunset, saw the Sunset during its glory days — and he dreamed of seeing that again.



Brother Isaac 'Ike' Robinson crossed burning sands on December 22, 1968, closing in on fifty-four years of service. He has held several offices in DDL and served its president for fourteen years. He is a 1955 New Stanton High School graduate in Jacksonville, FL. enrolled at FAMU in 1956 but soon opted for the U.S. Army, where he served a tour. He reentered FAMU and pledged Alpha Phi Omega (APO) in 1960 under Bro. Roosevelt Wilson, who was his Dean of Pledges. He finished FAMU in 1962 and was accepted into Law school.

Having no funding school, he received a teaching position in Palm Beach County, where he served the school system from 1962 – to 1992. Hi, my first stop was Roosevelt Senior High School under Bro. Britton G. Sayles (Principal). His next tour of duties included integrating Rivera Beach High (Suncoast CHS), JFK, and he finished his education career as an assistant principal at Roosevelt Junior High School under Bro. Joe Little (Principal). He retired in 1993 after thirty years of service. He served on the PB Police from 1993 – to 1998 as a police aid. In 1998 he ran and won the WPB Commissioner seat and held the position until 2015.
